1. All Dogs must be current on Rabies & Bordetella Vaccinations and a current shot record on file from their vet prior to boarding or playing in Doggie Daycare.
2. We encourage the use of a flea treatment prior to boarding. Dogs with Flea's will be treated at the owners expense.
3. We recommend that dogs enter and exit the building on a leash.
4. You are welcome to bring your own dogs bed and or toys; however Lake Wylie Pet Resort is not responsible for lost or damaged items.
5. Please bring your own dogs food to avoid an upset stomach
6. We reserve the right to adjust our fee's with out prior notice.

Protecting Against Kennel Cough with the Bordetella Vaccine

Pet owners spend a lot of time ensuring that their pet is healthy and well cared for. This means making sure that they are eating nutritiously, staying hydrated, engaging in mentally stimulating activities, and exercising. However, just as humans are susceptible to communicable diseases, dogs are too. Many boarding, grooming, and pet daycare facilities require that animals are current with their Bordetella vaccination. This can help to prevent them from contracting kennel cough.

What is Bordetella?

Bordetella bronchiseptica, commonly known as kennel cough, is an upper respiratory infection that mainly affects dogs, but can also affect cats, rabbits, and other animals as well. It is highly contagious and is spread when animals are in close contact with each other. It is common for kennels, groomers, daycares, dog parks, and other facilities that handle multiple dogs at once to require them to be vaccinated.

Though many cases of Bordetella are not life-threatening, there is a chance that it can become more severe and lead to pneumonia or even death. Puppies, older dogs, and those that are pregnant tend to be at a higher risk of contracting this disease due to having more compromised immune systems. In turn, they also run the risk of developing complications.

What are the symptoms of kennel cough?

Some dogs may show only mild symptoms, while others may be more severe. One of the most common signs is the presence of a dry, hacking cough that may have a “honking” sound. The dog may also have watery discharge coming from its nose. In more severe cases, the dog may be lethargic, run a fever, have loss of appetite, or develop pneumonia.

Symptoms develop within a few days of exposure. The veterinarian will typically run blood and urine tests to accurately diagnose Bordetella and check for any other complications.

How is it treated?

Uncomplicated cases of Bordetella are often left to run their course, similar to how humans would treat a cold. The dog may be given an anti-inflammatory to reduce discomfort. If they have developed pneumonia, antibiotics may be prescribed to fight infection. While recovering, they should be kept away from other dogs and allowed to rest comfortably. Removing their collar can help to ease breathing and alleviate potential discomfort. A harness can be used during walks instead.

Symptoms should begin to improve within a week but can linger for several weeks depending on the severity of the case. Many dogs recover within three weeks.

Is the Bordetella vaccine included with the normal vaccinations?

No, pet owners must ask for their dog to be vaccinated. Not all dogs are exposed to situations where they are around many other dogs, so the vaccination is not part of the standard course of care. The vaccination can be administered intranasally or as an injection. Those dogs that only occasionally get groomed or boarded may need a booster every year. For those that frequently go to daycare or the kennel, a booster every six months may be recommended.

Pet owners should talk to their veterinarian about whether their dog should have the vaccination and when boosters are needed. Staying up-to-date on vaccines is a proactive way to keep dogs healthier and prevent disease. For the safety and protection of all dogs, Lake Wylie Pet Resort requires proof of current Bordetella vaccination.
